

STANDING ORDER REGARDING SCHEDULING BOND MOTIONS

Pursuant to the provisions of O.C.G.A. § 17-6-1, all motions for bond before Superior Court shall be scheduled as follows:

- a) Motions to set bond, where the Magistrate is legally unable to set bond, shall be placed on the next available motion calendar, before the next available superior court judge. Said motions shall be heard within ten days after receipt of the petition. In the event the assigned judge also has a court date within ten days of receipt of the petition, the motion to set bond shall be set for that judge's motion calendar.
- b) Motions to reduce bond, modify bond, or motions to set bond where the Magistrate has declined to set bond but possessed the statutory authority to do so, shall be scheduled before the judge to whom the case is assigned.
- c) Once a case is indicted or accused, all motions regarding bond shall be set before the assigned judge unless otherwise permitted by the assigned judge.
- d) Motions to revoke bond shall be scheduled before the assigned judge.
- e) Motions for bond on violations of probation shall be scheduled before the judge who is assigned to hear the probation revocation hearing.
- f) Counsel may request to have a motion to set bond scheduled before an unassigned judge with the approval of both the assigned and unassigned judges.

STANDING ORDER REGARDING SCHEDULING BOND MOTIONS


Pursuant to the provisions of O.C.G.A. §17-6-1, all motions for bond before Superior Court shall be scheduled as follows:

- d) Motions to revoke bond shall be scheduled before the assigned judge.
- e) Motions for bond on violations of probation shall be scheduled before the judge who is assigned to hear the probation revocation hearing.
- f) Counsel may request to have a motion to set bond scheduled before an unassigned judge with the approval of both the assigned and unassigned judges.


