Dear Party/Attorney,

Alternative Dispute Resolution ("ADR") provides an opportunity to meet with a trained neutral third party who helps facilitate effective communication. The neutral's role is to assist the parties in working toward a fair, reasonable, and mutually acceptable resolution of their legal issues and concerns.

Please note that ADR may not be appropriate in all cases. To make this determination, the Domestic Relations Initiation Form includes a screening section. The Piedmont Circuit ADR Program, in compliance with the Georgia Commission on Dispute Resolution, is required to screen all domestic relations cases. Each party must complete their own screening form.

The form should be completed and returned to this office **before mediation is scheduled.** If preferred, the form may be completed online at: www.piedmontsuperiorcourt.org. If the form is not received in advance, the neutral will conduct the screening at the mediation session, and the additional time required will be billed to the parties. Once mediation begins, all fees are divided equally between the parties.

Confidentiality:

All answers are confidential and are not subject to discovery. If ADR is determined to be inappropriate, the Court will be notified only that the case is not suitable for ADR.

Your complete and honest answers are essential — both for ensuring safety and for resolving your dispute as efficiently as possible. Please complete the entire form promptly and return it to the email address provided above.
