**WHEREAS**, it has been determined that a judicial emergency exists in this county due to inclement weather such that a state of emergency has been declared by the Governor and Barrow County having closed all government offices for January 26, 2026;

**WHEREAS**, the emergency substantially endangers or infringes upon the normal functioning of the judicial system, the ability of persons to avail themselves of the judicial system, or the ability of litigants or others to have access to the courts or meet scheduled or time deadlines imposed by the court order or rule, statute of administrative rule or regulation;

**IT IS HEREBY ORDERED** that, pursuant to O.C.G.A. § 38-3-61, the operation of the Courts of Barrow County on January 26, 2026, are closed and cancelled. Unless otherwise ordered, operations of the courts will resume on January 27, 2026.


**IT IS FURTHER ORDERED** that, pursuant to O.C.G.A. § 38-3-62, all court deadlines, time schedules or filing requirements are hereby suspended, tolled, or extended for the duration of the judicial emergency as noted above; and

**IT IS FURTHER ORDERED** that the Sheriff or his designee shall post a copy of this Order on the courthouse doors; and

**IT IS FURTHER ORDERED** that the Clerk of the Superior Court, or her designees, shall immediately notify the Chief Justice of the Supreme Court and the Clerks of the Court of Appeals and Supreme Court by sending them a copy of this notice; and

**IT IS FURTHER ORDERED** that the County Manager, or his/her designee, shall post a copy of this notice and any subsequent modification or extension in accordance with O.C.G.A. § 38-3-63 by posting it on the county website or other appropriate public address system.

**IT IS FURTHER ORDERED** that the County Manager, or his/her designee, shall post a copy of this notice and any subsequent modification or extension in accordance with O.C.G.A. § 38-3-63 by posting it on the county website or other appropriate public address system.
